

## U.P Budget 2022 taps potential in Milk Production



Uttar Pradesh government in its budget for the financial year 2022-23, giving impetus to the state's milk processing capacity to double the current levels, Rs 79.82 crores has been earmarked to complete the under construction Green Field Dairy Plants in Meerut and Varanasi, which will not only promote milk production in those areas but also in the neighboring districts.

In addition, to promote cow rearing and milk cooperatives in the state, a budgetary provision of Rs 8 crore has been made, for the construction of a new dairy plant of 3000 litres per day capacity in district Mathura. For reviving and strengthening existing milk unions, the government has also dedicated Rs 60 crore in its budget for the year 2022-23. Uttar Pradesh is the largest milk producing state in the country and it accounts for more than 17 percent of the milk production in India.

## Milma turns to Ayurveda for cattle care, to produce drugs



In a major step towards the promotion of ethno-veterinary medicine, Milma is making an entry into ayurvedic veterinary medicines by commercialising some of the traditional medicines used by dairy farmers. It has collaborated with ayurvedic drug manufacturer Kerala Ayurvedic Cooperative Society (KACS) to produce medicines for treatment for commonly found diseases in cattle.

Milma received the licence to make and sell the products on Tuesday. Milma has vouched for the efficiency and cost effectiveness of the medicines. Malabar Regional Co-operative Milk Producers Union (MRCMPU) MD Dr Murali P said the project is aimed at a holistic approach to cattle health, increase productivity and produce high-quality milk completely free of antibiotic residue

## Himachal Pradesh government to launch 'hospital on wheels' for injured and sick animals



Agriculture and animal husbandry minister Virender Kanwar said the Union government has sanctioned ₹7 crore – ₹4.96 crore under the tribal sub-plan and ₹1.44 crore under the Schedule Caste sub-plan components – for setting up mobile veterinary unit (MVUs). “In the initial phase, 44 MUVs will be stationed at block-level. One veterinary doctor and one para-veterinary worker will be assigned to every ambulance. The vans will be stationed at strategic locations to minimise travelling time,” the minister said.

The project will cover the livestock population experiencing loss in milk production, decreased wool production and delayed maturity due to various livestock diseases caused by large-scale inter-state migration from adjoining states and lack of nutritious fodder. As per the 2019 Livestock Census, the hill state has 43,78,757 ruminants.


World Milk Day is intended to provide an opportunity to bring attention to activities that are connected with the dairy sector.

## Mother Dairy aims to turn 'Plastic Waste Neutral' by FY 2023-24



Mother Dairy, said it aims to recycle over 7,000 million tonnes (MT) of post-consumer used plastic waste by the end of the current fiscal and would become a 'Plastic Waste Neutral Company' by FY 2023-24.

Mother Dairy Fruit & Vegetable Pvt Ltd—a wholly-owned subsidiary of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) and commissioned in 1974— started its plastic waste collection and recycling initiative in Maharashtra under the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) programme in 2019. The company expanded the initiative across the country for the Multi-Layered Plastic Waste (MLP) in 2020

Mother Dairy in a statement said it has been working with its suppliers and leading Waste Management Agencies (WMA) for the implementation of the of the National EPR framework. The company, through its associated partners, has collected and co-processed/recycled around 8,164 MT of post-consumer used plastic waste (5,318 MT of Single Layered Plastic Waste and 2,846 MT of Multi-Layered Plastic Waste) from June 2018 till March 2022.

## Bora seeks Centre's help to overcome Animal Husbandry challenges

Assam Minister for Animal Husbandry and Veterinary, Atul Bora, has urged the Centre to extend all possible help to the state department under his ministry in order to overcome various challenges.

Apprising about his meeting with Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Parshottam Rupala, Bora said they discussed various issues of the state pertaining to his Ministry. Bora said that the Minister has assured all possible support in this direction.

"I had met Union Minister Parshottam Rupala and discussed various issues. Animal Husbandry and Veterinary is one of the oldest department of the state and it has many challenges before it to overcome. I have requested the Centre for assistance to overcome these challenges", he said.

Bora said he also discussed the implementation status of centrally-sponsored schemes in Assam and the timely release of funds at the earliest with Agriculture Secretary Manoj Ahuja.



## Vet ambulance service at all blocks in Kerala State



In a bid to support dairy farmers, the Animal Husbandry department will ensure veterinary ambulance service at all blocks across the State. Through the mobile units, the department aims to provide veterinary facilities, including the service of a doctor, at the doorstep of farmers.

"As part of the first phase, 29 ambulances will soon be operational with financial assistance from the Central government. Moreover, state-of-the-art ambulance facilities called Tele-Veterinary Units will be started at all district centres spending ₹1 crore," said Minister for Animal Husbandry and Dairy Development J.Chinchurani.

In collaboration with the State Bank of India, Kisan credit card has been made available to all dairy farmers. Dairy farmers can avail loans of up to ₹1,60,000 through Kisan credit card at subsidised rates and without collateral," she said.
