NDRI exhibits milk-based products, technologies on World Milk Day



To celebrate World Milk Day, an exhibition showcasing milk-based products and technologies was organised by the ICAR-National Dairy Research Institute (NDRI). Major innovative products and technologies included ghee with herbal extracts, curcumin fortified ghee, high-protein ice cream, mineral mixture, bajra biscuit, bajra lassi, silage production unit and paneer preparation unit, which were showcased at the exhibition. Milk adulteration detection kit was one of the major attractions for visitors.

On this occasion, an innovative technology, probiotic culture powder for direct vat set, was also launched.

Dr Dheer Singh, Director, ICAR-NDRI, inaugurated the exhibition and highlighted that about 20 per cent of the global population is directly dependent on the dairy sector as means of livelihood. Also he added, “the dairy sector is the largest contributor in India’s GDP”.

NDDB to ignite women dairy FPOs in UP



Uttar Pradesh govt. has officially urged NDDB Dairy Services (NDS), a subsidiary of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) to build a network of women owned milk producer companies in the state’s 17 districts.

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has publicly expressed his appreciation for Balinee Milk Producer Company, Jhansi and Kashee Milk Producer Company, Varanasi for their commendable work in the field of dairy development in the state. He even referred to Balinee as a model organization for women in his remarks at the IDF World Dairy Summit 2022 last year.

Nearly 1.50 lakh women milk farmers are likely to benefit from this initiative named ‘Uttar Pradesh Mahila Samarthya Yojna’.

Uttar Pradesh government had allocated Rs 200 crore for ‘Mahila Samarthya Yojana’ (MSY) in the budget of 2021-22. The project will be anchored by UP State Rural Livelihood Mission and the technical support will be provided by NDS.

DA&FW organises 1-Day National Workshop on “Per Drop More Crop”



A National Workshop on “Per Drop More Crop (PDMC)” was organised by Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (DA&FW), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India here today to discuss with the stakeholders the various approaches which can be adopted for increasing penetration of micro irrigation in the country. Participants from various Ministries/ Department of Central Government, States and UT’s, Irrigation Industries, Startups working in water management sector and Farmers Producer Organisations were present in the event.

Shri Manoj Ahuja, Secretary, Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) inaugurated the event. He emphasised on adoption of technologies in implementation of the programmes and focused approach for enhancing micro-irrigation coverage and thereby increasing overall efficiency and water productivity of agriculture for ensuring food and nutrition security of the country and incomes of the farmers, particularly in rainfed areas

Lakhs of dairy farmers of 22 milk producer companies pledge to boost milk output



World Milk Day was celebrated on June 1st, across various states, lakhs of dairy farmers and their families committed themselves towards making India the 'Dairy of the World', stated by NDDB Dairy Services (NDS).

Out of 22 Milk Producer Companies (MPCs) supported by NDS, 15 have all-women members and all the producer directors on their boards too are women. These 22 MPCs spread across 130 districts in 9 states, have 8.7 lakh members and 71 per cent of them are women.

Members of these 22 MPCs pledged to 'Make India Dairy of the World by increasing India's share to the total world production', provide quality milk and milk products to consumers by sourcing milk even from the remotest part of the country, and provide a competitive price to farmers through a transparent process of milk collection and payments.

They also committed to increase milk productivity through breed improvement programmes and better animal management practices.

Meenesh Shah, Chairman of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) and its subsidiary NDS, said, "Our Prime Minister has envisioned that India should become the dairy for the world. We are part of this proud community of milk producers and are working on numerous initiatives for enhancing production and productivity in India towards making the dream of the Prime Minister a reality."

Department of Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, Chandigarh Awarded SKOCH-SILVER Award 2023

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, Chandigarh got Skoch SILVER Award 2023 for e-Governance for computerisation of medical records of livestock being treated by the department. This is the first of its kind project in the country. Giving more details, Secretary Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, Shri Vinod P Kavle said that this web-based application software caters to five Government Veterinary Hospitals and nine Veterinary Sub-centres of the Animal Husbandry Department, Chandigarh.



The main objective of this application is to facilitate animal owners for online registration of their animals for treatment and other services like artificial insemination, vaccination etc. To maintain all records of Veterinary Hospitals and Sub-Centres like OPD, Stock book, daily medicine expenditure and artificial insemination.

Lumpy skin disease outbreak in meghalaya villages, 20 cows dead in shillong



Several villages in Ri-Bhoi and South West Khasi Hills districts of Meghalaya have been struck by an outbreak of lumpy skin disease among cows, leading the state government to declare them as infected. In Shillong, at least 20 cows succumbed to the disease in the Pynthorumkhrach area.

The villages of Sumer, Mawlyngkhung, Umpyrdong-Umden, Umkon-Umden, Saiden-Nongpoh, and Jyntru Nongpoh in the Umsning block of Ri-Bhoi district, along with Rangthong in the Mawkyrwat block of South West Khasi Hills district, have been declared infected.

Samples collected from these areas were sent to the National Institute of High-Security Animal Diseases in Bhopal, where they tested positive for lumpy skin disease. The state government, in consultation with the officials, declared the villages infected as a preventive and control measure, as reported by the news agency.

In a proactive move to combat the outbreak of Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD) in cattle, the Meghalaya government has officially declared several villages in the state as LSD infected zones. The affected areas include Sumer, Mawlyngkhung, Umpyrdong-Umden, Umkon-Umden, Saiden-Nongpoh, and Jyntru-Nongpoh in the Umsning C&RD Block of Ri-Bhoi District, as well as Rangthong in the Mawkyrwat C&RD Block of South West Khasi Hills District.

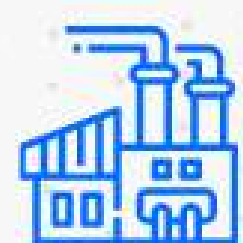
